Husbands, Wives, and Lovers Patricia Mainardi 2003-01-01 In this interdisciplinary exploration of the cultural and social history of early 19th-century France, Patricia Mainardi focuses on what was considered a major social problem of the time - adultery. In a period when expectations about marriage were changing, the problems of husbands, wives and lovers became a major theme in theatre, literature and the visual arts. The author demonstrates that this intense interest was historically grounded in the post-revolutionary collision between the new concept of the individual's right to happiness and the traditional prerogatives of family and state. duty or happiness more important? Are arranged marriages doomed to be empty of love and poisoned by adultery? Should adulterous wives and their lovers be punished while husbands may commit adultery with impunity? Out of such legal, social and cultural debates ultimately emerged modern bourgeois family values, Mainardi argues. And she illuminates how art, in all its varieties, both influences and is influenced by social change.

European Drawings 4 Nicholas Turner 2001-01-03 The collection of drawings at the Getty Museum was started in 1981 with the purchase of Rembrandt's Nude Woman with a Snake and has steadily expanded since then, so that now, at the turn of the new millennium, it stands at more than six hundred drawings and is, sheet for sheet, one of the best anywhere. The Getty goal is to create from the finest examples a collection of the different Western European schools of drawing before 1900, with special emphasis on the work of the most important and accomplished draftsmen. The collection now contains superb examples of the work of Leonardo da Vinci, Raphael, Michelangelo, Dürer, Rembrandt, Claude Lorraine, Watteau, Gainsborough, David, Millet, Manet, Van Gogh, and Degas. This is the fourth in the series of catalogues describing the drawings in the Getty Museum. Most of the drawings discussed in the present volume were chosen for the collection in the period of 1994 to 1998 and include examples from the Italian, German, Dutch and Flemish, French, Spanish, and British schools. Also included are several gifts from private collectors, which mark the start of a tradition that, it is hoped, will continue in the future. The catalogue entries for these new acquisitions are organized first by national school

and then by artist. The book also includes a bibliography and indexes of artists, former owners, related drawings, prints, and works in other media.

Art Gallery 2006-01-01 This beautiful and important book highlights the collection of European drawings at the Yale University Art Gallery, one of America's premier university museums. From intimate studies to exquisite finished compositions, this selection of works documents the history of European drawing practices beginning with late-medieval model books and progressing to the verge of the modern period. The accompanying text--written by a team of scholars--offers a unique introduction to various critical and technical aspects of the study of master drawings, brought to life through drawings from a range of national schools and in a variety of media. Among the drawings examined in this handsomely produced volume are an animated pen and ink sketch by Giulio Romano, a pastoral landscape by Claude Lorrain, a forceful and humorous caricature by Guercino, a scene from the epic poem Orlando Furioso by Jean-Honoré Fragonard, and a delicate portrait by Edgar Degas.

Broken Tablets Jonathan P. Ribner 2023-12-22 In this first study of art, law, and the legislator, Jonathan Ribner provides a revealing look at French art from 1789 to 1848, the period in which constitutional law was established in France. Drawing on several disciplines, he discusses how each of the early constitutional regimes in France used imagery suggesting the divine origin and sacred character of its laws. Primarily a study of art and politics, *Broken Tablets* discusses painting, sculpture, prints, and medals (many reproduced here for the first time), as well as contemporary literature, including the poetry of Alfred de Vigny, Alphonse de Lamartine, and Victor Hugo. Ribner assesses the ways in which legislation imagery became an instrument of political propaganda, and he clearly illuminates the cult of the law as it became personalized under Napoleon, monarchist under the Restoration, and defensive under Louis-Phillipe.

As a consequence the many very important works in the collection have not been discussed in major exhibition catalogues and have not received the scholarly attention they deserve. This volume, with full entries on the entire collection of 207 works by 45 leading scholars in their field, both American and European, and superb plates carefully checked against the originals, sets out to rectify this state of affairs. Artists represented by several works in the collection that Reinhart made his monument include: Cezanne (11), Chardin (4), Corot (9), Courbet (10), Daumier (20), Delacroix (9), Gericault (2), Van Gogh (5), Maillol (8), Manet (4), Picasso (4), Pissarro (2), Renoir (15), Sisley (2). A well illustrated introduction explains the ideas and context behind Reinhart's collecting and affords insights into his character.

Delacroix Émile Michel 2018-03-13 Ferdinand Victor Eugène Delacroix (Saint-Maurice, 1798 - Paris, 1863). Delacroix fut l'un des plus grands coloristes du XIXe siècle. La couleur était pour lui un moyen d'expression déterminant, qui avait la préséance sur la forme et les détails. Il parlait à l'oeil, moins à la raison. Il se nourrissait des oeuvres des coloristes du Louvre, en particulier de Rubens. Spirituellement, Delacroix s'inscrivait au coeur du mouvement romantique qui s'était répandu en Europe, se nourrissant de Goethe, Scott, Byron et Victor Hugo. Sa propre nature romantique s'enflammait au contact des leurs ; il était possédé par leurs âmes et devint le premier peintre romantique. Il tira nombre de ses sujets de ses poètes préférés, non pour les transposer dans des illustrations littérales, mais pour faire s'exprimer à travers son propre langage pictural les émotions les plus vives du coeur humain. Par ailleurs, c'est généralement dans les rapports entre plusieurs personnages, en d'autres termes dans le drame, que Delacroix trouvait l'expression naturelle et saisissante de ses idées. Son oeuvre n'est qu'un immense poème polymorphe, à la fois lyrique et dramatique, sur les passions violentes et meurtrières, qui fascinent, dominant et déchirent l'humanité. Dans l'élaboration et l'exécution des pages de ce poème, Delacroix ne renonce à aucune de ses facultés d'homme ou d'artiste, dont la vaste intelligence rejoint les pensées des plus grands de l'histoire, des légendes et de la poésie. Au contraire, il se sert de son imagination fiévreuse, toujours sous le contrôle d'un raisonnement lucide et du sang froid, de son dessin expressif et vivant, de ses couleurs fortes et subtiles, parfois dans une harmonie âpre, parfois éclipsées par cette note « sulfureuse » déjà observée par ses contemporains, pour produire une atmosphère d'orage, de supplication et d'angoisse. La passion, le mouvement et le drame ne doivent pas forcément engendrer le désordre. Avec Delacroix comme avec Rubens, il plane au-dessus de ses représentations les plus tristes, au-dessus du tumulte, des horreurs et des massacres, une espèce de sérénité qui est le signe de l'art et la marque d'un grand esprit.
