Valentin Haussmann (1565/70-ca. 1614) Robert Burgess Lynn 1997 Valentin Haussmann was a highly regarded composer in his time whose works had great popular appeal and were frequently reprinted, anthologized, and copied in lute or keyboard arrangements.
